2 Mar **An Introduction to Dendrochronology** *Dr Gretel Boswijk*

This talk will provide an introduction to the science of dendrochronology and its applications in archaeology and climate reconstruction. In particular, I will discuss the development of a 4500 year tree-ring chronology from kauri (*Agathis australis*) and how the kauri record is being used to enhance understanding of recent and past environmental change in New Zealand.

9 Mar **The West Antarctic Ice Sheet: Vulnerability in a Warming World** *Dr Christina Hulbe*

Polar ice sheets are the largest source of higher end, long term sea level rise on Earth today and the ice sheet in West Antarctica is the largest source of uncertainty in the sea level rise projection. In this presentation I will explain why this is the case and share insights from the Aotearoa New Zealand Ross Ice Shelf Programme, an interdisciplinary effort to better understand the processes at work in this complicated system.

16 Mar **Weather, Weather Everywhere** *Dr James Renwick*

New Zealand sits in the middle of the middle latitudes and feels the effects of the Southern Hemisphere westerly wind belt and its associated storms and anticyclones all year round. This talk will discuss the nature of the weather in Canterbury and over New Zealand, how the westerlies influence weather patterns across the South Island, and how human influence (climate change and the ozone hole) is affecting our day-to-day weather.
