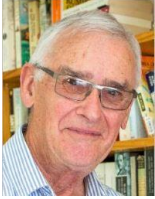

We will consider the global influenza mortality and recent research, and then concentrate on comparing the responses to the flu crisis in Temuka and Timaru. Mention will be made of the pa at Arowhenua and of the death of Dr Cruickshank in Waimate. We will conclude with advice on coping with a future flu pandemic.
