The Maths of the COVID-19 Pandemic 29 March

Mathematics can help us understand how diseases spread and how to stop them. During the COVID-19 pandemic teams of mathematicians around the world have worked hard to provide advice to governments and to help explain to the public what might be coming. In this talk I will give a very simple introduction to how this works and show how mathematics has been used in the COVID-19 pandemic.

Rapid Response to an Emergent Virus Prof. Miguel E. Quiñones-Mateu 12 April

SARS-CoV-2 first emerged in Hubei province, China, in December 2019. In mid-January 2020, several District Health Boards across New Zealand started planning the implementation of rapid diagnostic testing for this emerging virus. Around that time our group decided that we should be also be ready in case this new virus made it to our shores. Here I will describe our initial work to develop local COVID-19 diagnostic capabilities as well as leading the effort for the first isolation of SARS-CoV-2 in New Zealand. I will also discuss different ongoing studies related to PPE disinfection, anti-SARS-CoV-2 strategies and vaccine initiatives.
